Dublin Rural LEADER is excited to announce the launch of a free Capacity Building Training Programme for voluntary and community groups operating in the rural areas of Fingal, South Dublin, and Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown.

This training programme is designed to empower local groups with the tools and knowledge they need to strengthen their governance, build sustainability, and increase their impact.

Modules will include topics such as:

Social media and digital communications

Training will run from September to November 2025 once a week online, with 2 workshops included at accessible venues across rural Dublin.

Free SEAI Audit - SEAI's support scheme for energy audits (SSEA) offers SMEs a €2,000 voucher towards the cost of a high quality energy audit. In most cases, this will cover the total cost of the audit. Application to the scheme is easy, with automatic approval for eligible businesses.
